In 2022 Essex County Councils Public Health Team and Essex Youth Service worked with young people to further develop the Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) survey which ran in 2021 for 16-25 year olds. The survey reflects on the RSE that young people experienced at school and their awareness and experience of local sexual health services. This has helped us to understand the needs of young people in this age group and ensure that they are supported to have healthy relationships.


You prefer to look online for information or access to services.
