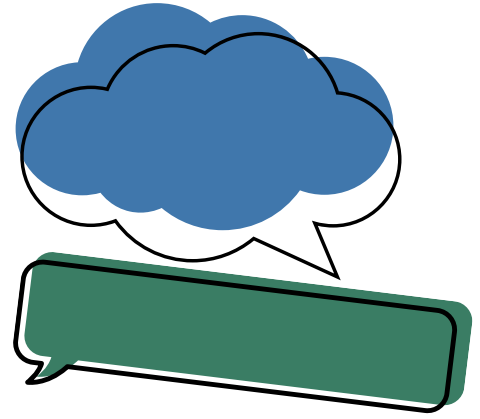


YOUTH SERVICE

You Said, We Did School years 10-11



In 2022 Essex County Councils Public Health Team and Essex Youth Service worked with young people to further develop the Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) survey which ran in 2021 for 16-25 year olds. The survey was developed to include age-appropriate questions for young people in school years 10-11 reflecting on the RSE that they experience at school and their awareness of local services. This has helped us to understand the needs of young people in this age group and ensure that they are able to access support, information and services enabling them to have healthy relationships.

You look to friends, family and school for information on RSE related topics.

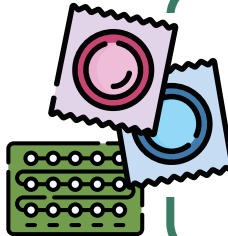


We did...

We have developed a training offer for schools to make sure teachers have the knowledge and skills to teach these topics.

Some of you were not aware of the following: Online STI testing services, Essex Youth Services, eC-Card, Essex Sexual Health Services, Brook website.

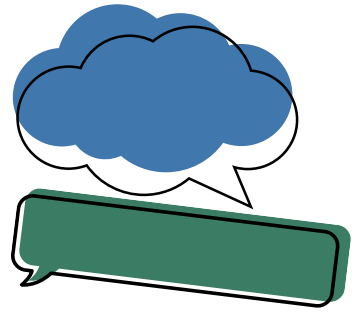


We are using your feedback to design a new young persons sexual health service website.
